

Computing - Creating Media - Digital Writing

By the end of this unit, children will learn to:

- Open a word processor
- Recognise and use keys on a keyboard
- Type capital letters
- Use bold, italic, and underline
- To make careful choices when changing text
- Change the font
- Use 'Undo' to remove changes

Design and Technology - Cooking and Nutrition - Smoothies

During this term, children will learn:

- Fruits have seeds and vegetables do not.
- Some fruits have seeds on the inside: kiwi fruit, apple
- Some fruits have seeds on the outside: strawberries
- Vegetables can grow either above or below ground.
- Vegetables are any edible part of a plant.

English - Reading

Children will continue their Little Wandle journey at their own pace, based on regular assessment.

English - Writing

Children will learn how to:

- Form all lower-case letters, capital letters and digits correctly. They will be correctly positioned on the line.
- Correctly size letters on 16mm handwriting lines.
- Use the prefix un-
- Use -er and -est where there is no change to the spelling of the root word.
- Write from memory simple sentences dictated by the teacher that include the GPCs and common exception words taught so far.

Consistently and independently know how to:

- Say out loud what you are going to write about.
- Compose a sentence orally before writing it.
- Break sentences down into words.
- Sequence sentences to form short narrative.
- Re-read what has been written to check it makes sense.

Consistently and independently know how to:

- Use some of the distinctive features of 'Standard English' in spoken sentences.
- Use capital letters for proper nouns.
- Leave spaces between words.
- Punctuate sentences with a capital letter and full stop.
- Punctuate the end of a sentence with an exclamation mark or a question mark.
- Join words and sentences using and.

History - Florence Nightingale

During this term, children will learn:

- That Florence Nightingale was a nurse who was born 200 years ago.
- The hospitals where Florence worked were dirty and didn't have everything they needed.
- That Florence went to help soldiers involved in a war. Here she cleaned up the hospitals to help soldiers get better.
- She was known as 'The lady with the lamp'.

Maths

During this term, the children will learn the following aspects of maths:

Multiplication and Division

- Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens
- Solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher.

Fractions

- Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity
- Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

Position and direction - Geometry

- Describe position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns

Numbers to 100

- Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals.
- Given a number, identify one more and one less
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones)

Music - Pitch (Superheroes)

During this term, children will learn to:

- Identify high and low notes.
- Perform high and low notes.
- Create and perform a two-note and three-note pattern.
- Identify and perform changes in tempo.
- Contribute musical ideas and cooperate within a group.
- Prepare and perform a musical piece.
- Demonstrate a musical understanding of tempo and pitch.
- Participate in discussions about pitch and tempo.
- Offer feedback to groups on their performance.
- Follow instructions during a performance.

PE - Striking and Fielding

During this term, children will learn to:

- Develop underarm throwing and catching.
- Develop overarm throwing.
- Develop hitting a ball.
- Develop collecting a ball.
- Get a batter out.
- Score points.

PE - Athletics

During this term, children will learn to:

- Move at different speeds over different distances.
- Develop balance.
- Develop changing direction quickly.
- Explore hopping, jumping and leaping for distance.
- Develop throwing for distance.
- Develop throwing for accuracy.

PSHE

During this term, children will learn:

- What the definition of a stranger is
- What they would do if a stranger or someone they did not know well approached them.
- What to do if I am in a situation that they do not like
- Which buildings are safe to go to
- Which people are safe to approach
- How to keep safe when picking up litter
- What materials can be recycled
- What their role is in keeping their school and local community tidy.
- Their wider role in keeping my local community and environment safe for humans, plants and animals.

RE - What does it mean to belong to a faith community?

This term, children will learn:

- A faith community is a group of people who believe the same things as each other about God or the religion they follow.
- People within the faith community will often have special events to welcome people such as an aqiqah in Islam or a baptism in Christianity.
- Faith communities will also have many symbols and items which show they belong to that religion, for example in Christianity you may often see the ichthus, this is a symbol known around the world to represent Christianity.
- Christians will also use a parable from the Bible to show how important people are.
- In Judaism you will often see a mezuzah or a seder plate to recognize that a person belongs to a Jewish faith community and there are special rules about what can cannot be done on Shabbat.
- In Islam the faith community will show what they believe about Allah and about Muhammad by what they wear and what they do, for example many Muslims will have calligraphy pictures at home to show they are Muslims.

Science - Seasonal Change and Plants

By the end of term, children will know:

- How plants change during the spring season.
- How the weather changes during spring.
- If a plant has grown without help from humans, then we call these wild plants.
- Garden plants are ones that have grown with the help of humans.
- Trees are a type of plant.
